What a day to be sat in front of the TV, sparkling water in hand (sober October getting annoying now)

We have Man Utd v Tottenham leading into racing from Donny and Cheltenham followed by an evening of Boxing. Strictly can wait or the catchup facility can be used.

A Saturday at Cheltenham is the best for any racing fan and this is the first we have had this season and it is going to be a cracker watching the big yards trade early blows.

One early thought it would seem the Paul Nichols has his team revved up early whilst Henderson, King and Hobbs seem to be more sluggish. We shall see more today of course and in the coming weeks.

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I always feel at this early meeting it's a chance for the smaller yards to land a victory or two as they can catch the big boys out for fitness. That's because a big owner/ trainer will be playing the long game and looking at having his horse cherry ripe for later in the season whereas for a smaller yard these early season targets can be a World Cup and Olympics rolled into one.

Which brings me to a horse at the peak of his form and fitness in Exitas who runs in the 3.10 at Cheltenham. Phil Middleton's chaser is here fresh from a win at Kempton and is lurking at the bottom of the weights. James Bowen takes another 7 lbs off and the horse is going to think he is running free. This is his big day and at 33/1 he will gives a real run for our money.

So get set for a serious Saturday punting session.

Today's Racing - By Rick Elliott

There are 36 Group races for which only two-year-olds are eligible and the final two are taking place on Saturday. The Horris Hill Stakes at Newbury is a Group 3 contest but the Racing Post Trophy is a Group 1 race and that is significant for Aidan O'Brien. The Irish trainer needs one more win at the highest level to set a new record for Group or Grade 1 wins in a calendar years. He trains the favourite for the Doncaster race in Saxon Warrior who is also prominent in the betting for the Derby.

There are only five Group 1 races for two-year-olds and the earliest is in September. The other four are at Newmarket and O'Brien has won three of them this season. He won the British Trainer's Championship by targeting the major races, including the Derby which he won for the sixth time with Wings Of Eagles. He has now won 29 British Classics and let's not forget he win three Champion Hurdles with Istabraq who he often jokes is the best horse he has ever trained.

O'Brien has the huge responsibility of training the expensive horse owned by Coolmore. The partners have made a massive investment in racing and they want their return. While O'Brien is producing the goods all is well with the relationship and he must have a fortune in goodwill in the bank. The demands are relentless and already the organisation is thinking about their Classic horses for next season.

O'Brien has a very modest and humble demeanour but to be seen as one of the best trainers in the world there must be ambition and determination. He would never admit

it in public but privately he must be proud of his achievements and breaking the record for winners at the highest level is one of his best. Rest assure he will be sending a strong team to Doncaster and won't be leaving anything behind at home.

Before the final declarations O'Brien still had 12 horses entered in the Racing Post Trophy. He must have a good idea of their relative ability and it looks his main weapons at Doncaster are Saxon Farm and the Pentagon, both high in the betting for the 2018 Derby. The winner of Saturday's race could become the strong winter favourite for the Classic that matters most.

However, O'Brien has won the Derby in the past with horses that have not run aged two and there could be the next superstar lurking in his stable who has not raced yet. We can assume Saxon Farm and the Pentagon are two of the better raced juveniles because O'Brien wants to win the Racing Post Trophy and set a new world record for Group and Grade 1 wins. Despite the odds The Pentagon could be his best chance.

Saxon Farm is a shorter price and on ratings and form is the most likely winner. However, The Pentagon has more experience and looks like the horse with most improvement to come. Ryan Moore rides Saxon Farm and Seamie Heffernan gets the mount on The Pentagon. O'Brien is odds—on to win the Racing Post Trophy and set the new mark but his second string could deliver this time. The Pentagon could become established as the best two-year-old in training in Britain and Ireland.

United Are Able As There Is No Kane - By Rick Elliott

England's chances of winning the World Cup go from minimal to zero if there is no Harry Kane. The big question of the day is can Tottenham cope with the absence of their best player and talisman against Manchester United at Old Trafford today. With Kane up front Spurs were fancied to win this fixture but the balance now shifts to the home team which means MANCHESTER UNITED must be backed at 23/20 with Betfair.

Chelsea are odds-on to beat Bournemouth in the second live match of the day and there is no value at backing them at price. There is an old adage that you should never back a team on the road at less than even money. This should not be a hard and fast rule but on balance Chelsea are a lay and not back bet at odds-on at Bournemouth. There seems to be some trouble in the camp and all is not well in the world of the manager who could be on his way very soon.

There are five kick-offs in the Premier League at the traditional time of 3pm on Saturday afternoon. More fixtures are being rearranged for the purposes of television but he who pays the piper calls the tune...which basically means if Sky or BT want a match to start at a time that suits them that is when it starts. The appetite for live football seems unlimited and one of the driving forces is betting. Today's Premier

League banker treble is Arsenal (v Swansea), Liverpool (v Huddersfield) and Man City (v West Brom) at over **Evens with bet365**.

Glasgow Rangers have just sacked their manager and they are away at Hearts today. They have not won this fixture in five years but one of the quirks of form can see them win this match on the road. Hearts are a young side and even RANGERS with no permanent manager can make experience pay so they are good things at Evens with Coral to pick up all three points in Edinburgh. You can add Rangers to the Premier League treble to double your money.

DECISION TIME (John Kiely) The mile and a half fillies maiden that she won at Fairyhouse on Tuesday was probably an egg and spooner, but there was no doubting her superiority once Emmett McNamara pressed the button. She will have no trouble getting a mile and six and two miles is by no means out of the question either.

GLENS HARMONY (Willie Mullins) A sister of Glens Melody and potentially every bit as good. She has excellent bumper form and while she was very green on her hurdling debut and had to make the running, she still delivered in style. Will go the mares novice route, where she will undoubtedly have to cross swords at some stage with other gifted stablemates.

GRAN GESTE (Liz Doyle) Is highly regarded by his shrewd and still under rated trainer and made a winning debut in the bumper at Thurles on Thursday seeing off some well fancied - and more experienced - rivals from leading stables. Clearly progressive.

MAGIC OF LIGHT (Jessica Harrington) A warm favourite at Thurles for a stable that knows the time of day and met traffic problems when second to smart winner La Bella Vida. Quick compensation awaits.

MIND'S EYE (Henry de Bromhead) Understandably no match for the unbeaten Samcro at Punchestown but sure to more than pay his way in lesser company. Looks nailed on to land a maiden hurdle next time out.

SYNOPSIS (Gordon Elliott) Won a tricky enough fillies flat handicap at Navan which contained some useful and well proven performers. Clearly back in good heart and will soon be winning again over hurdles.

THOMAS O'MALLEY (Joseph O'Brien) Sharp Dundalk winner could be a useful dual performer but any enthusiasm for hurdles must be tapered down a bit as he simply has to have good or faster ground.

U S NAVY FLAG (Aidan O'Brien) Could there ever be a more aptly named Breeders Cup winner at Del Mar, the track where "the surf meets the turf"? This horse has been transformed by blinkers and clearly thrives on his busy schedule.

WAR DECREE (Aidan O'Brien) Now here's the thing. Churchill is going to the Breeders Classic as an afterthought, a bid to restore a fading reputation ahead of stud duties. And who knows, the change of climate and surface might do the trick, never underestimate Aidan. But get this. War Decree has had the Classic as his target since he ran in the French Derby! And he's available at 50/1 with Paddy Power and Betfair, with the latter going Non Runner No Bet. Too good to be true? . . maybe, but with NRNB you've nothing to lose . . and remember in this column back in April I gave you Winter at 33/1 for the 1,000 Guineas. Could lightening strike again?
