

Team In Focus: Burnley - By Rick Elliott



BetFan are producing a weekly feature of a Team in Focus and are working through the 20 teams in the Premier League. The leading teams in some of the main leagues in the rest of Europe will also be covered. During the summer we will look at the key statistics for the four teams playing in the finals of the UEFA Nations League.

This week the Team In Focus is **BURNLEY.** Maximum points from their last two fixtures have just about taken them to safety so Burnley will almost definitely not be facing the nightmare scenario of a drop into the Championship. Those two wins followed

three defeats so there has been the threat of relegation into March. However, with Fulham and Huddersfield down there is still the possibility that Burnley could be dragged into the mire. However, they have enough experience to secure the one more win that guarantees Premier League football for another season.

Here are the five most significant Premier League trends that can be used when betting on Burnley during the rest of the Premier League season:

- No goalless draws at home.
- First scorer in 9 fixtures.
- Both teams have scored in 10 of 16 home matches.
- 3 away matches have produced no goals.
- 2 bookings per match on average.

Prospects For The Rest Of The Season

Wins in the last two fixtures have been crucial for Burnley's survival prospects and they look safe. Only four teams have conceded more goals, including three at the bottom of the table. Burnley have lost eight matches at home in the Premier League but have drawn only two. Cardiff are five points away from safety and Burnley have won nine more points than that team. Their finishing position will be anywhere from 11th to 17th and on current form that could be nearer the top half of the table than one place above the relegation places. The home match on Saturday against Cardiff is huge but Burnley have the form and ability to pick up three points.

Another Great Win For A Tiger?

There are five joint leaders after the second round of the US Masters and all are major champions. Another quite famous golfer is one shot off the pace because a guy called Tiger Woods is right in the mix. The best round of the quintet on Friday was produced by LOUIS OOSTHUIZEN who can still be backed at 11/1 with Ladbrokes.



Tottenham have a perfect record at their new stadium and Huddersfield are unlikely to spoil that when the teams meet there is the Premier League today. A 2-0 win against Crystal Palace in the Premier League and 1-0 lead over Manchester City in the Champions League represents a great start to life at the new home. Huddersfield are already relegated and the absence of Harry Kane should not affect the result. Another TOTTENHAM WIN TO NIL is expected and that outcome is 5/6 with Ladbrokes.

Manchester United have not won any of their last four league matches following a fixture in the Champions League. Three days after losing narrowly to Barcelona at Old Trafford they meet West Ham at home in the Premiere League. West Ham have not won in eight outings but United have just one win in their last five. The return leg in Barcelona is being played on Tuesday but the home team need points for Champions League qualification. They should just get the job done so MANCHESTER UNITED TO WIN 1-0 is the best bet at 15/2 with **bet365**.

The highlight of six meetings in Britain and Ireland is the Scottish Grand National at Ayr (3.35). It is the highest betting turnover race after the English version and contests at the Cheltenham Festival. No outright favourites have won the race in the last 10 years. VINTAGE CLOUDS fell at the first fence in the Grand National last week but can make amends by winning the Ayr marathon at 9/1 with **bet365**.



Trackside In Ireland - By Declan O'Donoghue

It was Student Race Day at Limerick on Thursday which meant the Patrickswell venue was packed tight with 7,500 youthful and enthusiastic racegoers.

Limerick is very much a "horses for courses" track and local hope Internal Transfer proved the point when making it three from three at the venue.

It was an impressive start in handicap company for the 4/1 shot though his jumping, so often a strong point, was suspect this time under smart 3 lbs. claimer Donal McInerney.

The Eric McNamara trained runner could build on this, though whether we'll see much more of him in the near future is not clear. While the going was officially good here - indeed they had to water - the Kayf Tara gelding will certainly not be risked on anything faster.

Earlier Torquay was on target for McNamara and, in contrast to her stablemate, she jumped superbly. Another difference is that the 5/1 shot actually likes good ground and indeed would probably prefer it even quicker.

She made all and Eric explained: "We wanted to be in the first two all the way and were not afraid to make the running if we had to."

"We were hoping we had the best horse in the race and we planned to stay out of trouble as she tends to jump better when she has room. If the handicapper isn't too harsh hopefully we can follow up with another win."

So often the bridesmaid, Debuchet had to settle for second place again as the even money jolly was beaten by the always prominent Cosmos's Moon who scored at 4/1 for the in form Noel Meade/Sean Flanagan combination.

Sean wasn't keen on trying to make all but Meade insisted on those tactics and was proved right. One favourite who did oblige and was not winning out of turn was 6/4 hotpot Gipsy Lee Rose who took the opener for Joseph O'Brien and Shane Shortall.

Hard luck story of the day was The Church Gate in the beginners chase. The 7/2 chance was cruising like an assured winner under Keith Donoghue but was forced out at the second last and jockey Rachael Blackmore, who finished third on well backed market leader - 9/4 to 6/4 - Eviscerating picked up a three day ban from the Stewards.

Quick compensation surely awaits The Church Gate.
