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The Rest Hope Newcastle Can Beat Man City - By Rick Elliott

There is a common theme in the live TV matches this weekend and on Monday in that all four fixtures bring together teams who are in contention for qualifying for the Champions League and opponents who could face the nightmare scenario of relegation to the Championship. In fact each fixture is between a team in the top five and a team in the bottom six. The Premier League does not always go to script but Manchester City surely will not drop points at home to Newcastle.

After being demolished and run ragged by Liverpool City will want to get their season back on track. However, for such a dominant team and the champions-elect four points in three matches represents a dip in form. Liverpool had the pace and energy to give the City defence a torrid time but Newcastle do not have the players to do something similar. Liverpool have created the blueprint for beating the league leaders but Newcastle will not be able to emulate their performance.

Bookmakers had seen some money for City to go through the Premier League season without losing a match. Arsenal fans and the Invincible's of 2003/04 were no doubt chuffed that they lost at Anfield but the manner of the defeat is more significant. The City back five including the goalkeeper were constantly harried into making mistakes and Liverpool's three goals in the second half were avoidable. The result will probably be a blip but if Newcastle avoid defeat at the Etihad Stadium the teams in pursuit could make ground because they have winnable fixtures.

If the unthinkable happens and Newcastle cause a huge upset Manchester United would close to nine points off the pace with a win at Burnley. Liverpool are the team in form and must be fancied to beat Swansea on the road. Potentially they could be 12 points behind City at the end of this week's programme. Backing odds-on shots away from home is fraught with danger but in this case Liverpool cannot be opposed for their trip to South Wales. Swansea have one win in six matches while Liverpool have won the last four and were brilliant against City.

Brighton have picked up five points in their last six fixtures but Chelsea have not won any of their last six Premier League matches. They didn't field their best 11 in the FA Cup against Norwich but clearly things are not right at Stamford Bridge. Antonio Conte gets wound up at the best of times but his demeanour was even more frenzied during the replay with Norwich. Chelsea scrapped through on penalties but ended the match with nine men after Pedro and Morata were dismissed for minor offences.

After a small hiccup Tottenham have now won four of their last five matches and Harry Kane can't stop scoring. However, they are 18 points behind City which is a huge number for a team with aspirations to win the Premier League. Southampton have the worst six-match form in the division but were unlucky not to win at Watford last weekend. They were beaten by a late goal scored by a Watford player with his hand.

Tottenham look the most vulnerable of the big clubs and Southampton can beat them. Newcastle are unlikely to do them and the other top teams a favour.

They say every successful football team must be solid in defence. If you don't concede goals you don't lose matches. Being secure at the back means front players know if they sneak a goal there is a good chance three points will be in the bag. The top team in the Championship have conceded fewest goals and the team immediately behind them have got the second best defensive record in the league.

That is Derby who have kept eight clean sheets in their last 11 matches. Tonight they play Bristol City at home and that team have let in 12 goals in their last four visits to Pride Park. With Wolves good things to win the league this second versus fifth clash is massive in the context of who claims the second automatic promotion place. Home advantage can be key which means DERBY should be backed at [11/10 with Ladbrokes](#).

If everybody is playing for second place in the Championship it seemed there was a similar situation in the Masters snooker. Ronnie O'Sullivan beat Marco Fu 6-0 in his first match but then lost to Mark Allen in the next round. Shaun Murphy is trying to win the Triple Crown which only 10 players have achieved and comprises winning the World Championship, UK Championship and Masters during their career. With O'Sullivan out Murphy has a great chance to win the three biggest titles in snooker as he already has the World and UK titles on his CV. However, if the dream is to stay alive he must get past a player called Trump today. That's Judd and not Donald who MURPHY can beat at [6/5 with William Hill](#).

Whether a horse has had a wind operation may seem irrelevant but from today trainers must inform the regulators a horse has had that procedure when declaring to run. When assessing the relative merits of horses in a race information is paramount but the state of a horse's wind seems like a lot of hot air. A 'w' will indicate that a horse is running for the first time after undergoing surgery for wind. With Musselburgh in doubt the only definite race that qualifies is the Chepstow 3.20pm. ALBEROLLO has undergone an operation of the kind that has a 50% chance of improving a horse's performance which means the [13/2 with Betfair](#) to win today could be a steal.
