Tiger Woods Can Win Another Bay Hill Title - By Ian Hudson

In 1986 Jack Nicklaus won the US Masters six years after his previous major championship win. Tiger Woods won the last of his 14 majors in 2008 but he is now the second favourite to win the US Masters for the fifth time. The former world number one is playing in the Arnold Palmer Invitational this week and he is the favourite for the event. Woods combines course form and current form and is in great shape to get his career back on track by winning this title.

Woods looked on course to surpass Nicklaus's tally of 18 majors but he has not won one since the age of 32. A professional golfer is at his peak in his thirties so its amazing that Woods has not won a major during the last eight years of his fourth decade. Injuries have blighted his career for about five years and his personal life has not helped his golf on the course. Woods can win the Arnold Palmer event for the ninth time and go to Augusta full of confidence.

This week's tournament is synonomus with the Bay Hill course in Orlando, Florida. It is generally a tough track and its rare for a player to record four rounds below 70. Bay Hill has hosted this tournament under a number of titles since 1979. Woods won here four years in a row from 2000 to 2003 and he has by far the best course form in the field. He was joint second in the Valspar Championship last week, finishing just one shot behind the winner, Paul Casey. Woods can go one better at Bay Hill.

Water is a feature of 7 holes, although it doesn't always come into play for the professionals. However, it is a factor on the 18th hole. The traditional Sunday pin position encourages an approach over water. None of the four par 3s are easy but the

long holes will provide plenty of eagle and birdie opportunities. The greens are above average in size and have many slopes. The course is a good fit for Woods and this is the ideal location for another PGA Tour win.

Last November Woods was 80/1 to win the 2018 US Masters but his price has tumbled to 12/1. He is the second favourite behind Dustin Johnson but the market leader for Bay Hill this week. A Woods at his best would demolish this field and he looked close to it last weekend. He did nothing wrong down the stretch but Casey came from well off the pace with a 65 to win in the States for the first time since 2011. The English player is now 25/1 to win the Masters Tournament.

Rory McIlroy plays this week and he needs a strong tournament. He made a decent start to the year in European Tour events but has struggled in the States. His main focus is the US Masters, the only major he has not won. Only five players, including Woods, have completed the career Grand Slam by winning each of the four majors at least once. McIlroy is not suited to this week's course so there could be more frustration as he searches for his best game. Tommy Fleetwood and Justin Rose are playing in Orlando this week.

The perfect scenario would be Woods and McIlroy fighting out the Masters in the final round. If he won McIlroy would deserve the Grand Slam but Woods would also be a worthy winner. There is a dress rehearsal this week and Woods can prevail to record yet another win at Bay Hill.

Black Op Can Upset the Hot Pot In The First

Good morning and happy Cheltenham Festival day 2. Readers of yesterday's preview are sitting pretty after Summerville Boy and Coo Star Sivola did the business. It was a draw between bookmakers and punters as three favourites won but Apples's Jade was turned over as the odd-on favourite. Today the name on everybody's lips is Samcro in the Ballymore Properties Hurdle (1.30).

There were five odd-on favourites in ante post betting and the accumulator paid 10/1. The worst case scenario for the bookies of all winning is not possible now after Apple's Jade was only third in the mare's hurdle. Samcro is the next odd-on shot to run and the horse looks vulnerable in a field of unexposed novices. Samcro has only won at Grade 3 level but BLACK OP was unlucky not to win a Grade 2 race and the horse can beat the favourite at 10/1 with William Hill.

The clash of the week is on in the Champion Chase. Willie Mullins has said in the past that Douvan is the best horse he has trained and Altior is the best chaser in training in Britain. It's been a question of will they/won't they but both horses are engaged today.

Douvan is a dual festival winner as is ALTIOR and the latter is preferred. The horse remains unbeaten over obstacles so should be backed at 11/10 with Ladbrokes.

The romantics would like to see Black Corton win the RSA Chase. The horse has won eight chases this season and will be ridden by Bryony Frost who is one of the stories of the campaign. Black Corton won the Grade 1 novices' chase at Kempton on Boxing Day so is proven at the highest level. Presenting Percy won at the meeting last year and that is a massive positive. However, MONALEE acts on heavy, has won a Grade 1 novices' chase and is the standout bet at 7/2 with Coral.

Chelsea are up against it in the Champions League tonight. They are playing at Barcelona in the second leg of their last 16 tie and the first match at Stamford Bridge ended in a one-one draw. Chelsea have only failed to score in one of their last 12 fixtures in the Champions League and Barcelona always find the net at home. Therefore, the logical bet is BOTH TEAMS TO SCORE at 17/20 with Betfair.
